






The Holiness Code

Leviticus chapters 17-26
due to its highly repeated
use of the word *Holy*




Laws concerning idolatry, the slaughter of animals, dead animals, and the consumption of blood (Leviticus 17)

The separation of each set of laws is indicated by the phrase "what man soever there be of the house of Israel" (verses 3, 8, 10, 13)




📖 Verse 3 begins the law regarding killing domestic animals at the tabernacle.

The prohibition is directed against the killing of animals without offering them to the Lord.



📖 Verse 8 begins the law regarding the offering of sacrifices at the tabernacle.

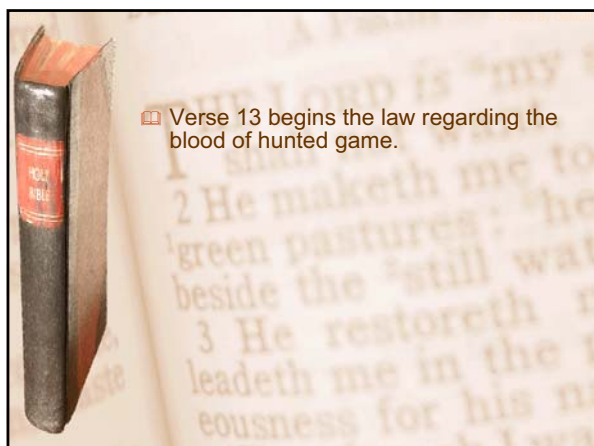
The prohibition is directed against sacrifices that are not offerings unto the Lord.



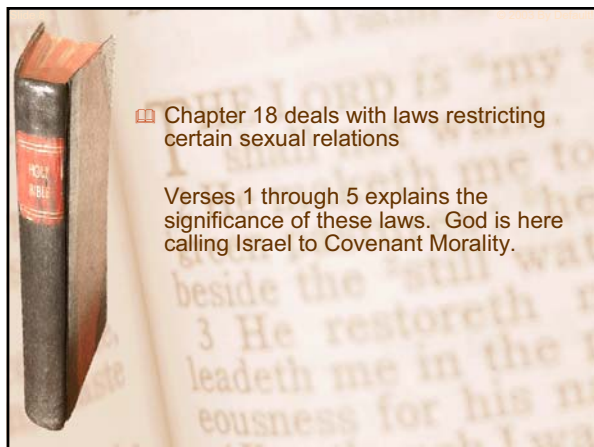
📖 Verse 10 begins the law regarding the eating of blood.

Eating blood is prohibited throughout the Bible but this passage explains why.

1. The life of the creature is in the blood. (Sanctity of Life)
2. The blood makes atonement for one's life. (Sacredness of atonement)

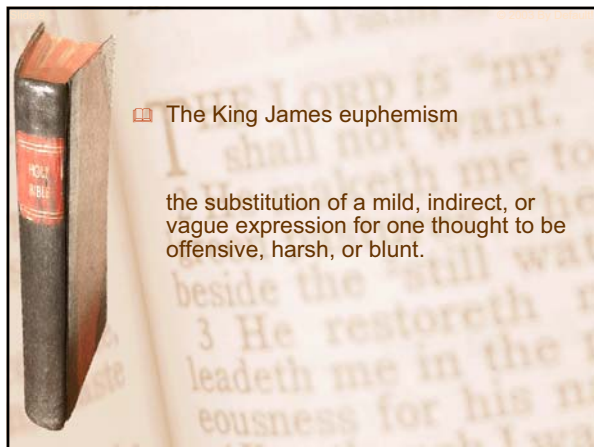


📖 Verse 13 begins the law regarding the blood of hunted game.
