Israel spent over 2 years between leaving Egypt and leaving Mt. Sinai.

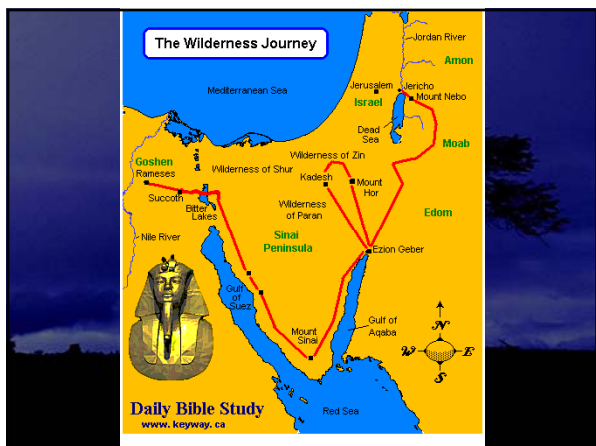
On the 20th day of the second month in the second year, the cloud was lifted from the tabernacle and they begin their journey through the wilderness.

A third name of the place in the wilderness of Paran is Kibroth-hattavah which means "graves of lust". This name is given by Moses because it became the burial ground of the mixed multitude who had lusted for flesh (meat) and God gave them quail beyond what they were able to digest.





When Israel left Hazeroth they camped in the Desert of Paran. It is clear that Hazeroth, Kibroth-Hattaavah, and Taberah, and Kadesh are all smaller sections of the larger desert of Paran.
