The first thing that God did with Israel in the book of Numbers is to organize its leadership. (Numbers 3: 18-24, 27-30, 33-35). Gershonites 7500 males Kohathites 8600 males Merarites 6200 males	
Each clan of leadership is given a specific area of responsibility: Gershonites were to camp on the west side of the tabernacle and be responsible for its curtains and coverings. (Num. 3:25–26; 4:21–28, 38–41)	
Kohathites were to camp on the south side of the Tabernacle and are responsible for its furniture (the Ark, the lampstand, etc.). (Num. 3:31–32; 4:1–20, 34–37)	

Merarites were to camp on the north side of the Tabernacle and are responsible for its crossbars, posts, frames, etc. (Num. 3:36–37; 4:29–33, 42–49):	
Note that every clan had a designated area and a specific responsibility.	
After the Leadership had been organized, God then establishes some immediate bylaws. 1. He establishes a code of discipline and correction. (Numbers 5:1-4)	

2. He establishes a code of ethics on how men should treat each other. (Numbers 5: 5-10).	
3. He establishes a code of marital fidelity and the removal of jealousy (Numbers 5: 11-31).	
4. He establishes a principle on covenant commitment. (Numbers 6: 1-21)	

5. He establishes a Priestly benediction. (Numbers 6:22-27)
