The Appointed Times and Seasons

Not only did the Lord set out these Feasts for His covenant people, but He also ordained the set times and seasons in which they were to be kept. The time was "appointed."

Leviticus 23:4

"Life is about timing."

- “You cannot afford to wait for perfect conditions. Goal setting is often a matter of balancing timing against available resources. Opportunities are easily lost while waiting for perfect conditions.”

1. For His Covenant People
 2. At His Prescribed Timing
 3. In His Designated Place

The Appointed Place

The feasts were to be celebrated in the place which God appointed. This place was where The Name of the Lord was recorded.

Deuteronomy 12: 5-14

God "tags" a place with His Name and declares it as the territory for His people. He has "tagged" the Church as His place.

The Appointed Sacrifices and Oblations

The prominent truth that the Lord endeavored to teach Israel was that of Blood Atonement. Blood was everywhere at the feasts. The approach to God can only be through sacrificial blood.
